### CITI FIELD Queens, New York

Citi Field is a major league baseball stadium in an outer part of New York City in Queens New York, and the home of the New York Mets. Citi Field was built as a replacement for the Shea Stadium, the previous home stadium

for the Mets since 1964. Construction began in 2006 and the new stadium, named Citi Field opened on April 13, 2009. The stadium was named for Citigroup Inc., a financial services company, who purchased the naming rights for \$20 million annually over the next 20 years.

The cost of the new stadium and other infrastructure improvements was \$610 million, with the Mets picking up \$420 million of that amount. The agreement includes a 40-year lease that will keep the Mets in New York until 2049. The new stadium has a seating capacity of 45,000 and installed 12,000 square feet of integrated scoring and video boards throughout the stadium. Citi Field has many interesting and unique attractions including the Jackie Robinson Rotunda, the main entrance to the stadium, dedicated to Jackie Robinson, the first black player in Major League Baseball. <sup>1</sup>
