DENVER ART MUSEUM – MARTIN BLDG Denver, Colorado

The Denver Art Museum (DAM) is one of the largest art museums between Chicago and the West Coast. The

museum's global art collections represent cultures around the world, with more than 70,000 works of art in 12 collections, including African art, architecture and design, art of the ancient Americas, Asian art, European and American art before 1900, Latin American art, Oceanic art, modern and contemporary art, photography, textile art and fashion, Indigenous arts of North America, and western American art. The museum's global collections also reflect work by artists from Denver and the Rocky Mountain region. In 1971, the museum opened the North Building, now known as the Martin Building, designed by renowned Italian modernist Gio Ponti in collaboration with James Sudler Associates of Denver. The eight-story, 210,000-square-foot building allowed the museum to display its collections under one roof for the first time. With construction completed in 2019 and the campus scheduled to be reopened in its entirety by the end of 2021, the Martin Building renovation and expanded gallery will provide more public access and increase the museum's ability to serve its average of 800,000 visitors per year. ¹
