Johns Hopkins University is America's first research university, a place that has revolutionized higher education in the U.S. and continues to bring knowledge and discoveries to the world. The

university, founded in 1876, takes its name from 19th-century philanthropist Johns Hopkins, an entrepreneur and abolitionist with Quaker roots who believed in improving public health and education in Baltimore and beyond. Johns Hopkins enrolls more than 24,000 full- and part-time students throughout nine academic divisions. Their faculty and students study, teach, and learn across more than 260 programs in the arts and music, the humanities, social and natural sciences, engineering, international studies, education, business, and the health professions. The university has four campuses in Baltimore; one in Washington, D.C.; one in Montgomery County, Maryland; and facilities throughout the Baltimore-Washington region as well as in China and Italy. Their esteemed graduates include visionary CEOs and scientists; famous conservationists and authors; winners of Oscars, Grammys, Emmys, and Pulitzer Prizes; such as film director Wes Craven and President Woodrow Wilson. ¹
