The Montreal Heart Institute (MHI) (French: Institut de Cardiologie de Montréal) is an ultra-specialized hospital center dedicated to care, research, teaching, prevention, rehabilitation and the assessment of new

technologies in cardiology. The MHI was founded in 1954 by Dr. Paul David and is affiliated with Université de Montréal. The institute is the leading specialized cardiology hospital in Canada and one of the largest cardiology institutes in the world. Its internationally recognized Research Centre was the first one entirely dedicated to cardiovascular disease and to this day remains one of the world's best cardiology research facilities. Their team is comprised of 248 doctors, 546 nurses, and 82 researchers who specialize in clinical, basic and applied research. Over 700 students per year work and study in 8 clinical departments: internal medicine, psychosomatic medicine, nuclear medicine, heart surgery, anesthesiology, radiology, medical biology and pharmacy. Their facilities include: 153 beds, 4 operating rooms, 7 hemodynamic rooms, 3 electrophysiology rooms, 1 angioradiology room, and 1 magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) room dedicated to cardiovascular patients.¹
