## SIMON FRASER UNIVERSITY

Simon Fraser University (SFU) is a public research university in Canada, with three campuses in British Columbia's three largest cities -- Burnaby (main campus), Vancouver and Surrey. The university was founded in 1965 and named after an early Canadian explorer well known for his efforts in charting majority of the British Columbian territory. With the mission to be Canada's leading community-engaged research university, its main Burnaby Mountain campus was designed by noted Canadian architects Arthur Erickson and Geoffrey Massey to foster interdisciplinary contact between students and researchers. The university provides 193 undergraduate degree programs and 127 graduate degree programs to more than 35,000 students. SFU is consistently ranked among Canada's top comprehensive universities and is also the first Canadian member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), the world's largest college sports association. <sup>1</sup>
