The United States Postal Service (USPS) is an independent agency of the executive branch of the United States federal government responsible for providing postal

service in the United States. With the passage of The Post Office Act of 1792, the Postal Service became a permanent fixture of the Federal Government. The U.S. Postal Service is the only delivery service that reaches every address in the nation: 160 million residences, businesses and Post Office Boxes. The Postal Service receives no tax dollars for operating expenses and relies on the sale of postage, products and services to fund its operations. With more than 34,000 retail locations and one of the most frequently visited websites in the federal government, the Postal Service has annual operating revenue of more than \$71 billion and delivers 48 percent of the world's mail. With more than 630,000 employees, they are one of the nation's largest employers. The Postal Service is at the core of the \$1.6 trillion U.S. mailing industry that employs more than 7.3 million people. The Postal Service processes and delivers 472.1 million mail pieces each day. ¹
